Country Breakfast Pie

Serves about 6

- 1 frozen pie crust
- 8 oz. pork sausage, browned & drained
- 1 cup southern-style frozen hash browns, thawed
- 1/4 C shredded sharp cheddar cheese
- 1/4 C sliced green onion
- 1/4 C chopped red/green pepper
- 4 large eggs
- 1/4 C milk
- 1/4 tsp seasoned salt
- 1/4 tsp coarsely ground pepper

Preheat oven to 375°F. Place crust on baking sheet. Sprinkle sausage around bottom of crust. Top with hash browns, onions, peppers & cheese. Beat eggs, milk, salt and pepper until well blended; pour over sausage/potato mix in crust. Bake 30 minutes or until egg mixture is cooked & crust is lightly browned. Sprinkle with additional cheese & peppers, if desired.

Troutville's first bank, in 1907, was called "Farmers and Cannons Bank" and was located in the small white building next to the current Town Hall. It was the youngest, but one of the strongest banking institutions of the county. The amount entrusted to the Bank in deposits was \$80,000. Officers included:

President	John W. Layman
Vice President	C. N. Huff
Vice President	C. E. Layman
Vice President	M. W. Firbaugh
Cashier	Gull Barber
Assistant Cashier	D. Price Hylton

This Bank became The First National Bank of Troutville and today is part of Bank of America.
